New Detentions Bureau Manual Policy: C-1600 Incarcerated Person Counts

The Detentions Bureau has added Section C-1600 Incarcerated Person Counts to the Detentions Bureau Policy and Procedure Manual (DBPPM). This new policy has an effective date of September 22, 2022.


Jail Management System (JMS) - CJIS is the current Jail Management System

Section C-1600 – Incarcerated Person Counts has been added, and the following changes have been made:

- The use of body counts has been removed from the Detentions Bureau Policy. All
 counts will now be a Face-to-Card count. This is being instituted to ensure accurate
 counts, to prevent escapes, discrepancies in the count, etc.
- The way that incarcerated persons are to be maintained in the Jail Management System (JMS) has been revised. The Court Deputy at each facility will be responsible for maintaining the JMS system for all incarcerated persons leaving and returning to the facility.
- Housing Deputies will still be responsible for maintaining the JMS system for all inner facility movements involving the incarcerated people in their units.
- All count times have been standardized and will be conducted at the same intervals for all facilities in the Detentions Bureau.
- Facility specific policies detailing count will be deleted: PTPPM D-230, JFPPM C-310, and CRPPM I-500.
- The primary way to verify count has been changed. The facility staff member that
 is responsible for maintaining the facility count will now use the Facility Count
 System (FCS) to verify the facility count is accurate. The Facility Count System



- To print a copy of the Facility Count System the staff in charge of maintaining the facility count will need to go to the link above and:
 - Click on the "Actions" tab.
 - Move the mouse over the "Export" option.
 - Select "Excel".

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- Open the file in Microsoft Excel.
- Click the "Enable Editing" button on the top of the spreadsheet in Excel if prompted. You will need to enable editing to be able to expand rows.
- Clicking the plus sign (+) button for your corresponding facility will expand rows showing your facility count.
- Go to the "Print" tab.
- On the print tab there will be an option at the bottom of the page labeled "Scaling". Select "Fit All Rows on One Page" and then print. This will give you a one-page document with a breakdown of your facility.
