Hate Crimes Training Update

To ensure compliance with California Penal Code Section 13519.6, **ALL** sworn personnel in the Deputy Sheriff, Detentions Deputy Sheriff, Park Ranger, and Community Service Technician (CST) ranks are required to participate in the POST Learning Portal self-paced training entitled "Hate Crimes: Identification and Investigation." 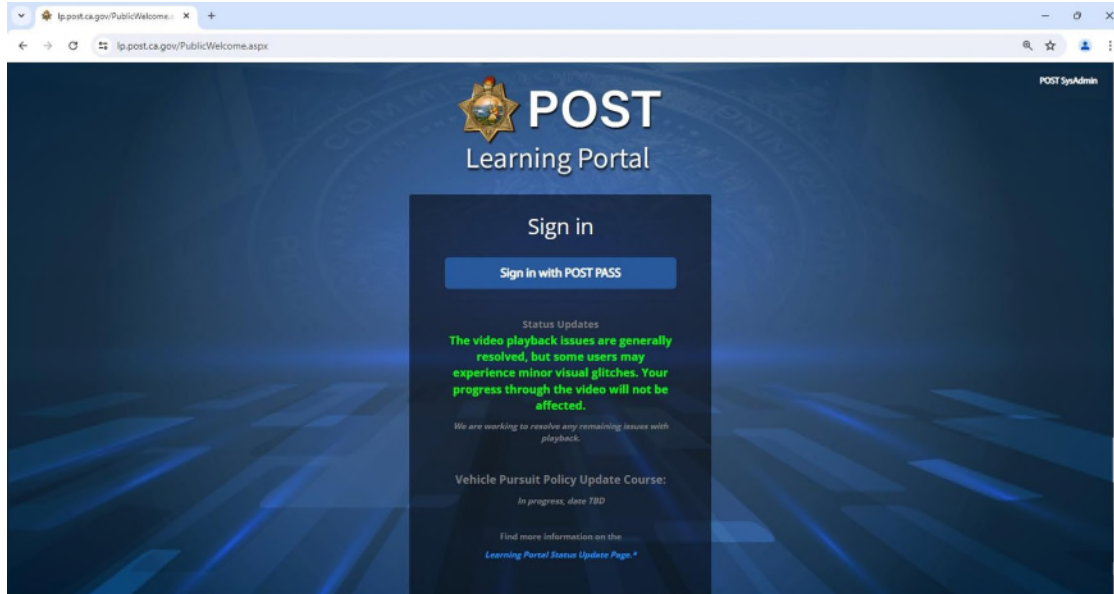

All affected personnel must review and acknowledge this training bulletin, as well as complete the self-paced training **no later than November 14, 2025.**

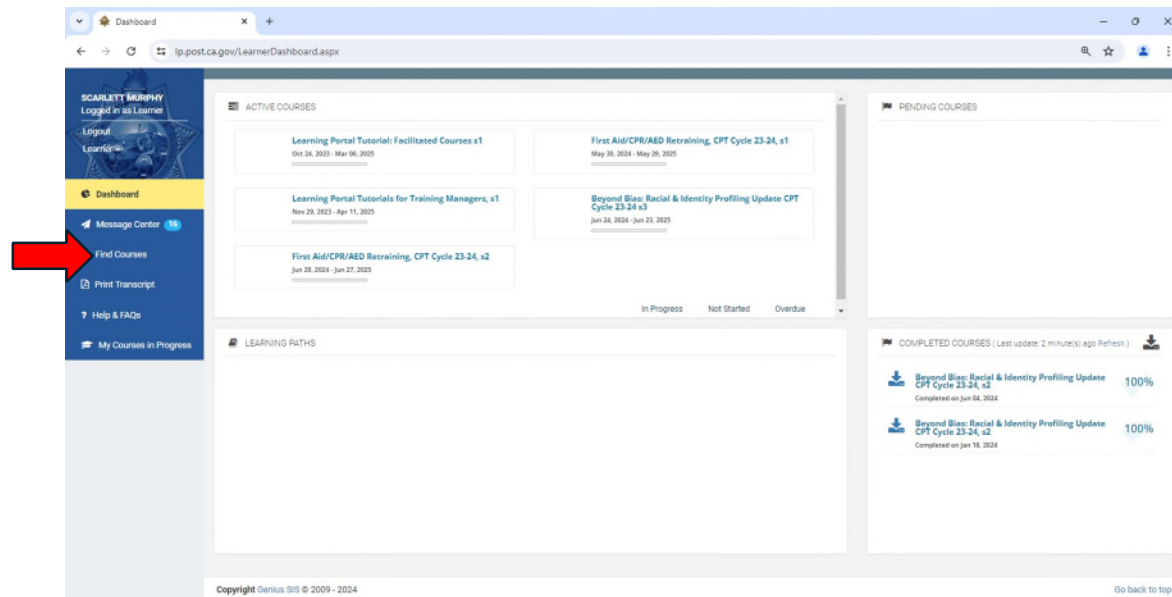
POST LEARNING PORTAL – Hate Crimes: Identification and Investigation

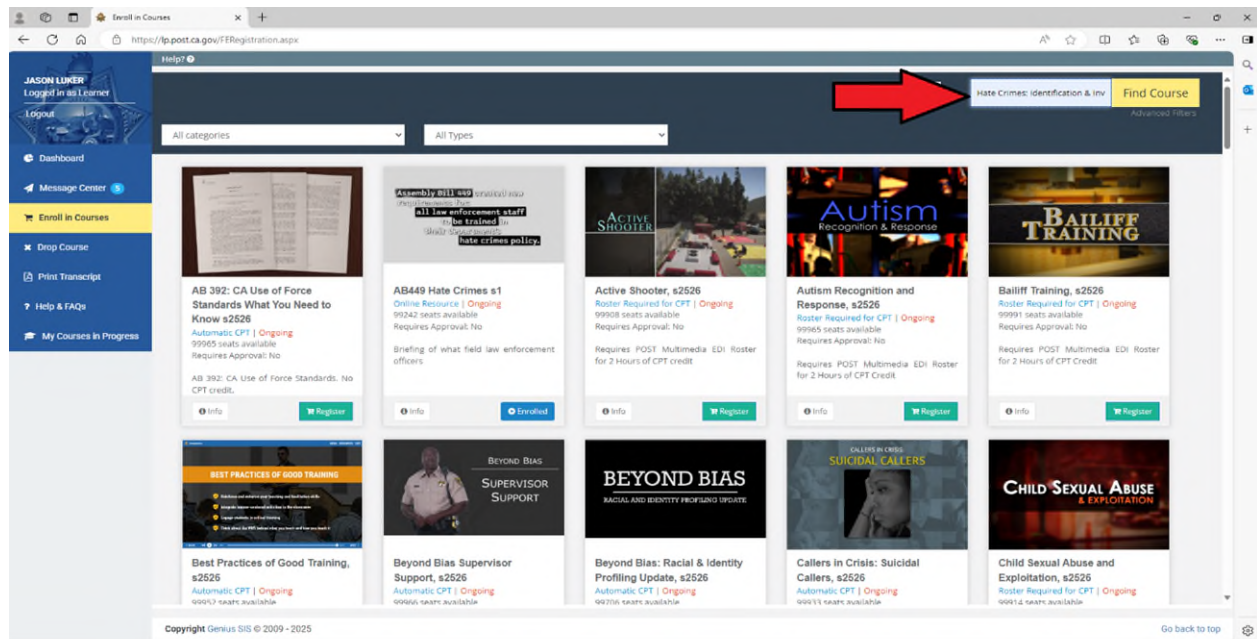


STEP 2: FIND COURSE Click on “Find Courses”

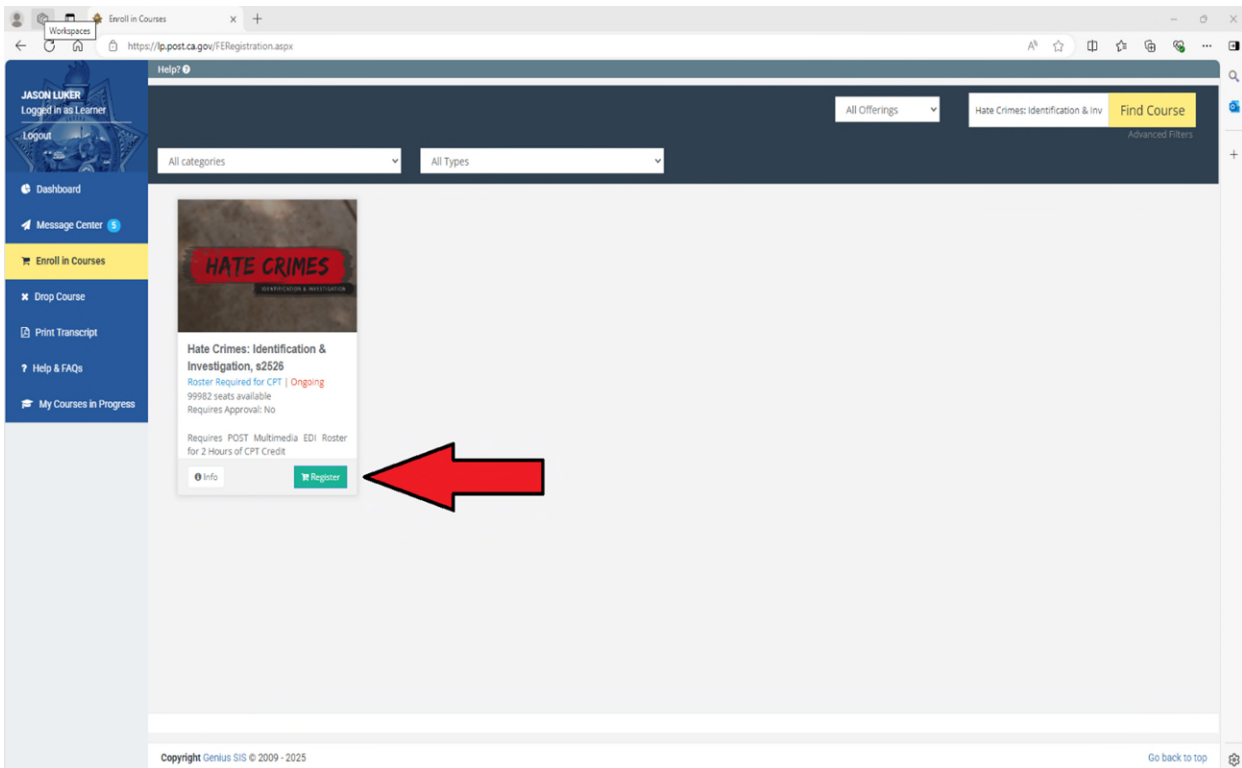

Find the “Hate Crimes: Identification & Investigation” course



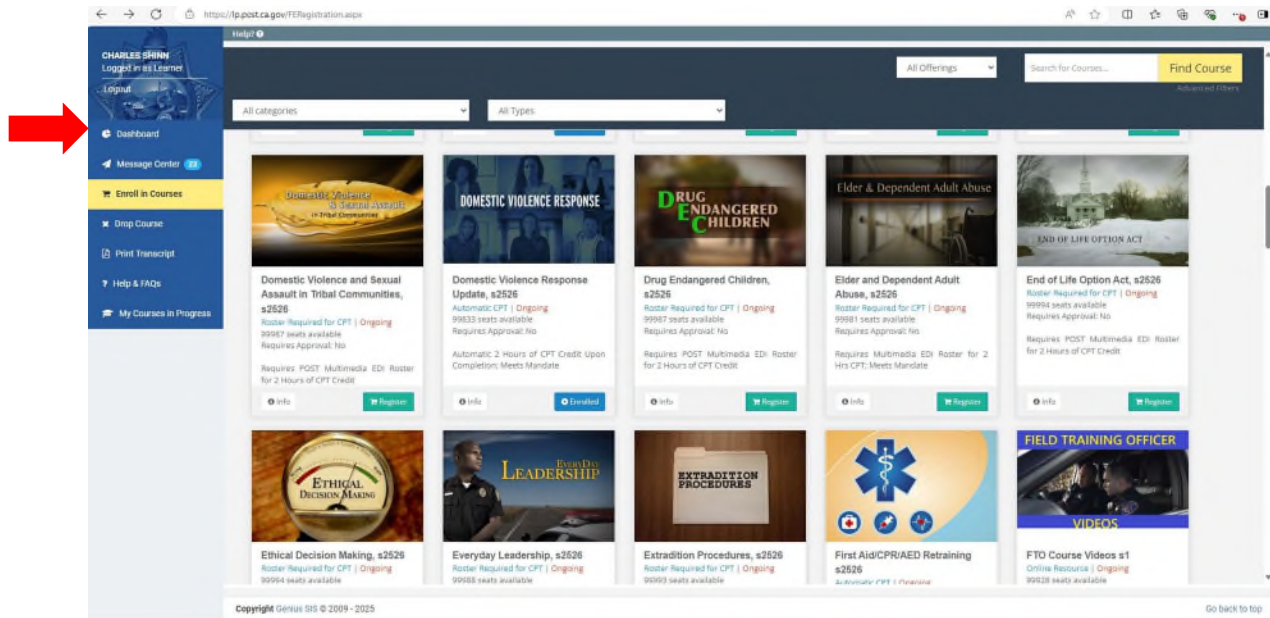
Click on the “register” button



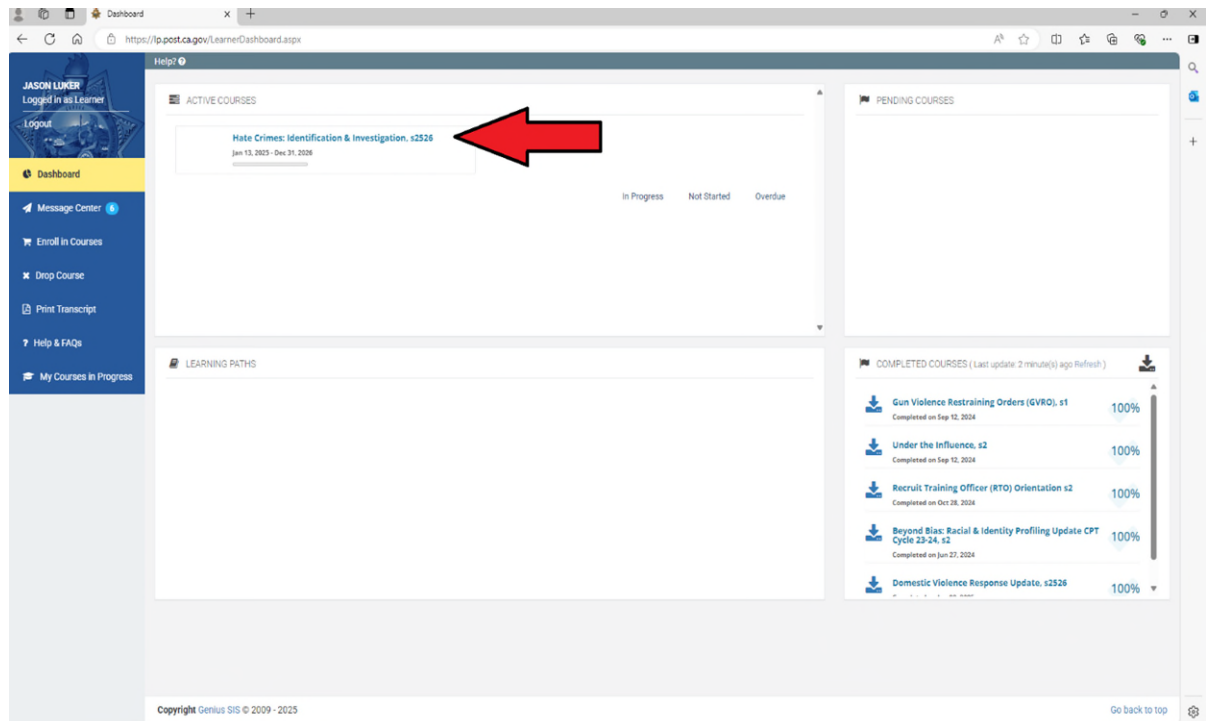
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STEP 3: START COURSE

After you are registered and enrolled, click on your Dashboard to open the course from your active courses.



From the “Active Courses click on the Hate Crimes course.”



Click on “start” or “continue” to begin course and follow the prompts to complete the course.

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STEP 4: PROOF OF COURSE COMPLETION

After you complete the course, your Dashboard will be updated; the “Hate Crimes: Identification & Investigation” course will be shown under “Completed Courses.” You will receive an email from POST stating that you have completed the training.

NOTE: If you are unable to view the certificate, you will need to log back into the training course and ensure all sections have been completed.
