High-Technology Crimes Training Pursuant to PC 13515.55

To ensure compliance with PC 13515.55 and as best practice, **all** personnel in the ranks of Sergeant, Senior Deputy, Deputy, Reserve Deputy, Park Ranger Sergeant, Senior Park Ranger, and Park Ranger are required to read this training bulletin and complete the POST Learning Portal "High-Technology Crimes" 4-hour self-paced course.

This course provides you with skills to handle high-technology crimes, and you will learn to:

- Identify crimes possibly involving electronic devices
- Review relevant sections of the law
- Review the proper way to collect computer equipment and data for preservation evidence
- Identify how to obtain a CalECPA search warrant.

Personnel who must complete this mandatory training will need to log into their POST Learning Portal account and complete the "High-Technology Crimes" training. The training can be accessed via the link below:

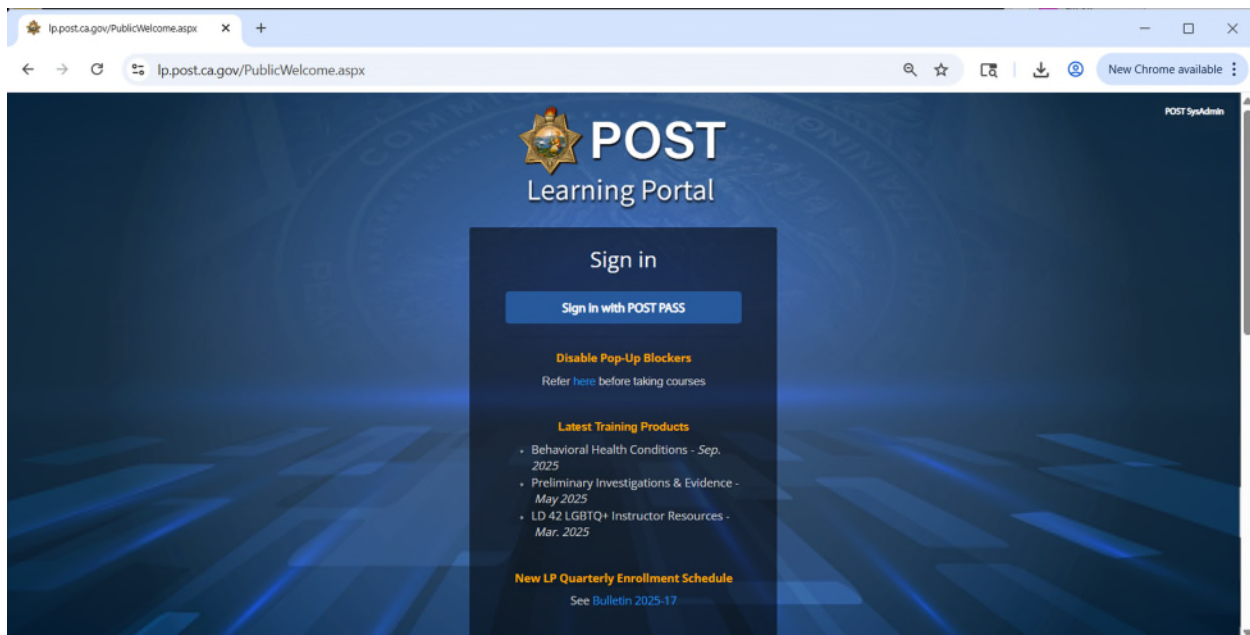

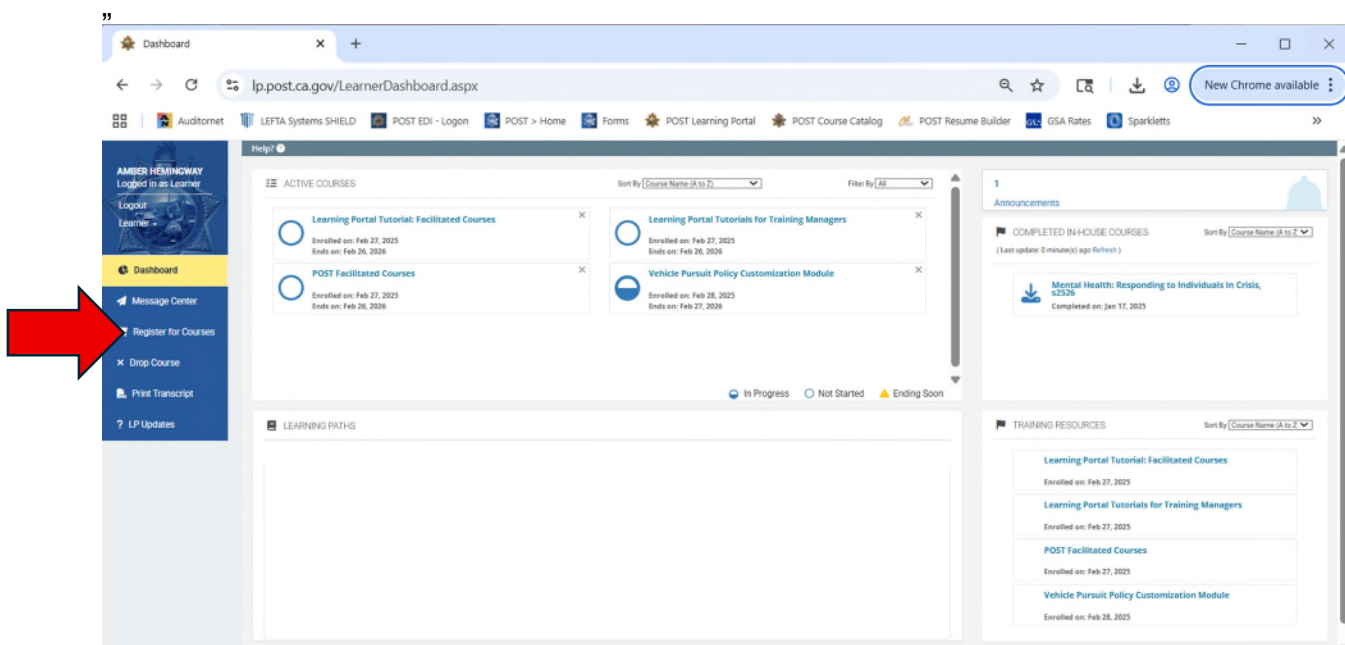
STEP 1: LOG INTO POST LEARNING PORTAL

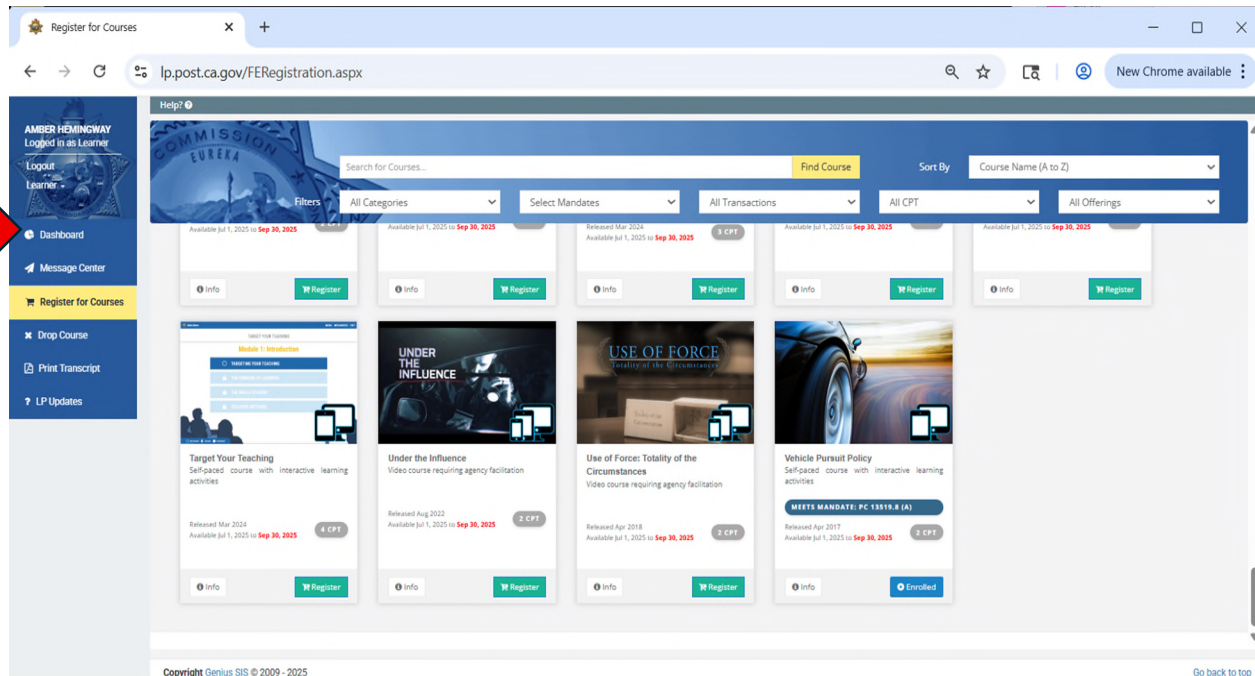

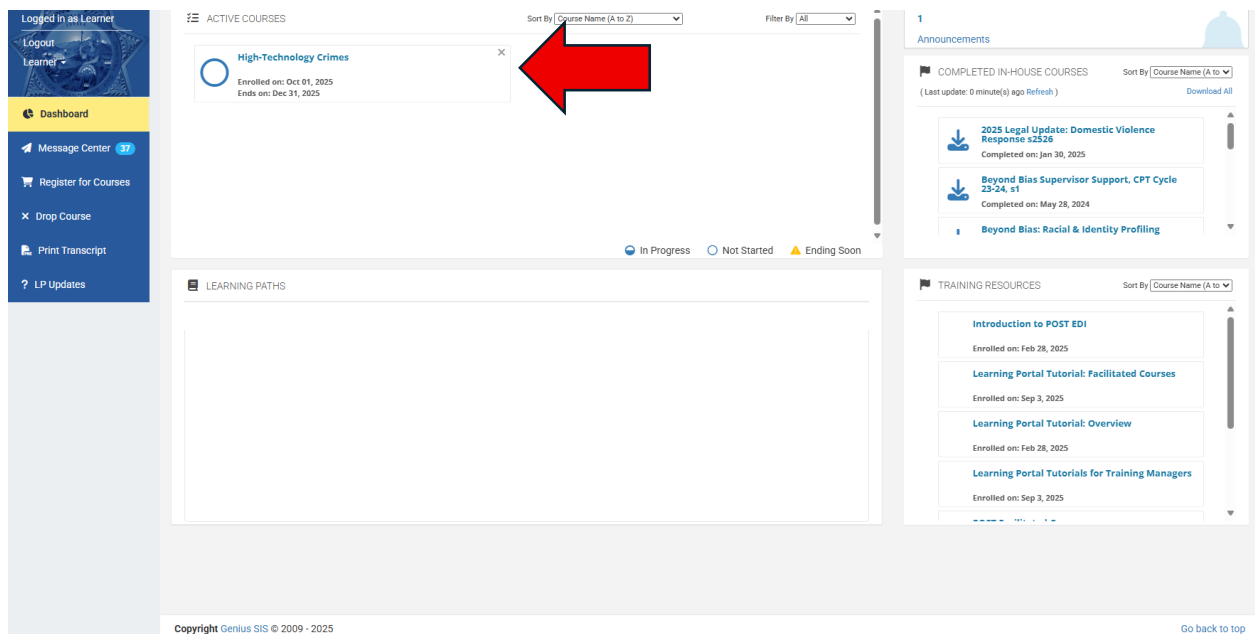
STEP 3: START COURSE
